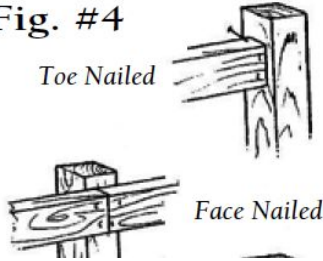


# TOE NAILED VS FACE NAILED FENCING

## What's the difference?

There are many ways to build a fence. Sometimes, customers request the fence to be built where the fence posts are more visible. Toe-nailing is a custom way to build the fencing where the posts and rails are nailed in a different way. This takes more time and effort than the standard methods of face nailing. There is a different in the way the fence appears in the finished product and different tools are used to do toe-nailing, such as finishing nail guns. These photos below show the specific differences in the finished fence product.
