

What Does It Mean to "Stake Out" A Job Site?

Prior to an installation, your estimator will meet with you again to mark your jobsite. The entire fence layout will be reviewed with you. He will use wooden stakes in the ground, as well as may use white paint to mark the ground for the installers. Please do not move the stakes or repaint on the ground, as this may confuse your installation team as well as alter the final product.



When Will This Be Scheduled?

The office will contact you to schedule this prior to your installation. This appointment can be made in advance, after you sign your contract and proceed with the process for installation.

Do You Need To Be Home?

It is best that you are home for this process. This will help prevent any confusion as to where the fence line will go, as well as make sure that you and your estimator are on the same page for the fence installation overall. If there are changes, the estimator will review that with you at this appointment. If there are significant changes that may alter what materials are required or work to be performed, this may change your installation date.



Is This When Utilities Are Marked?

No. We contact NC or SC 811 directly on behalf of you to have your home marked for underground utilities. NC or SC 811 will perform this prior to the installation. They will use multiple color sprays on the ground as well as flags when marking different lines. We will use WHITE paint on the ground to mark the fence layout as needed, however, any other lines in the path of the fence and work area will be marked by NC or SC 811. They will not mark private lines.
